



An Integrated Fire and Rescue Service

In parts of Region South Fire and Rescue Service's area of responsibility the firemen sometimes face hostility when they perform their duties. Verbal threats, spitting and even stones are sometimes thrown at vehicles and firemen. These neighbourhoods are often poor and socially stigmatized with a high amount of immigrants among the inhabitants. Research has shown that people in these areas feel less safe than in other parts.

ONE WAY TO OVERCOME this lack of trust and prevent violence from escalating in the future is to employ firemen and community advocates with an immigrant background. They can bring language skills and a cultural awareness to our organization that we lack today. Firemen with a multicultural background can also serve as role models for the youth in these neighbourhoods.

TODAY THERE ARE VERY FEW FIREMEN in Sweden with a non-swedish background. To change this fact, we initiated a project together with the Swedish Employment Service Agency and the city of Malmö. During a 10 months period we train 24 youths with immigrant background to become firemen or community advocates. None of the students are guaranteed a job, but our main goal is to hire as many as possible at the end of the project.
